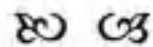
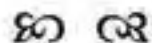

The Exeter Quaker meeting house is on the East side of Oley Creek - immediately on the western side of Point, was Boone's birth place was on Oley Creek - above it water.

1876

Danl Boon ap. w. of Charles Reed enters 100 A on Boon's Creek from to Hickman then Down P. Creek to the River thence up the River till a N. Corner to Hickmans line will include y<sup>e</sup> quantity by Treaty of a Certificate granted by S. Court 12 day Feb. 1780. J. Marshall

Danl Boon ap. w. of Benj. Stenslow enters 500 A upon a N. M. to be -gin at y<sup>e</sup> Mouth of Dait's Creek on the lower side & to run N. till a due W. Course from the P. line will strike Hickmans Line thence along the said line to Mahons line thence with Mathewsons line to his Corner from thence with the said Course to Kaintuckys thence up the same to the Beginning

Entire July 4<sup>th</sup> 1780 J. Marshall  
Danl Boon ap. w. of Israel Boon enters 300 A on part of a T. M. N<sup>o</sup>. 10208 it being y<sup>e</sup> Vacant lands between Hickmans line & P. Boon's own 3 Surveys on both sides Boon's Creek.

April 8<sup>th</sup> 1783. J. Marshall  
Danl Boon also enters 200 A on part of a T. M. N<sup>o</sup>. 10208 being y<sup>e</sup> Vacant Land between P. Boon's line & Dumfords line Boon's Creek & y<sup>e</sup> Kaintucky <sup>1141</sup> and Allowing for John Howards Entry of 200 Acres

Please to enter for me in your office one thousand Acres of Land (part of  
a Military Warrant of 3000 Acres in my Name) herewith sent to you, as follows:  
"To include a Lick and Salt Spring upon a Branch about eight or ten Miles  
from where it empties into the South Fork of Sandy Creek (on the South Side  
thereof) called Swetts fork, and to some course. The Mouth of this fork  
is quered at about 40. Miles above the Junction of the said South Fork  
with the main middle fork. This Survey to begin at a white Oak eight  
poles to the South East of the said Lick and Spring; thence North 400 poles,  
thence West 400 poles; thence South 400 poles; and thence East 400  
poles to the Beginning... Saml. R. Old. Servant  
To the Surveyor of the  
County of Fayette

1781 December 24<sup>th</sup>

Sir

I request the favour of you to deliver the above Letter and a Military  
Warrant of 3000 Acres which you have applied to the Surveyor of Fayette  
as soon as he swears in, and begins to take Entries. May be particular in  
doing it immediately after the Swearing in. And you can drop the  
first thousand you intended to enter for me. I am able to do  
So, as Daniel Boone.
